


# 2010-2011 Annual Report

### Introduction

The Palo Alto Junior Museum & Zoo shines as a community gem which strives to engage a child's curiosity in science and nature. In the heart of Palo Alto, the JMZ continues its mission with the support of the Friends of the Palo Alto Junior Museum & Zoo and its generous member base.

During the 2010-2011 fiscal year, the Friends reached substantial milestones in their efforts to support the JMZ and its mission. The following are some highlights of this year's activities.

## Science Outreach Program



As part of our commitment to foster children's curiosity in science, the Friends' Science Outreach Program strives to extend quality science education to students in low-income areas.

Overall, the Friends sponsored 182 science classes for students in Willow Oaks Elementary School in East Palo Alto. Additional classes were also offered through a partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of the Peninsula. JMZ instructors who visited these schools brought rich context and concrete elements to potentially abstract concepts like electricity, sound, animal lifestyles, chemical reactions and volcanoes.

Willow Oaks teachers have stated a high satisfaction with the caliber of JMZ instructors, hands-on materials, live animals, and how the class content ties directly to grade-appropriate curriculum.

## **Exhibits**

#### Africa's Bats



The Friends and long-time supporter Karen Christensen funded the bat house renovation which resulted in a new exhibit, Africa's Bats, and opened in October 2010. The Friends helped the JMZ acquire 10 new Egyptian Fruit Bats to join the Straw-Colored Fruit Bats. The \$25,000 renovation features panoramic views of an African cave and tropical rain forest. The size and layout of the cave allows the bats to fly about the cave and climb along the vines and rocks as they groom each other and feed. Special effects such as special cave lighting, elaborate murals, and handcrafted fruit bowls help create an authentic African bat cave experience.

#### Buzzzz



Buzzzz lets kids explore
the beauty of bugs and
their fascinating life stories
through hands-on exhibits
and by observing living and
pinned insects and spiders.
Buzzzz encompasses various
developmentally appropriate
activities for children aged 0
to 9. The Friends gave nearly
\$50,000 to help fund this
exciting new exhibit which
opened in June 2011.

## **Events**




We held four Members-only events over the past year: Moms & Muffins, Halloween Zoo Night, Dads & Donuts and the opening of Buzzzz.
